The term was coined by researcher Robin Alexander and, after his studies on the power of talk, developed in the early 2000s. Alexander proposed a framework for teaching that is designed to generate opportunities for those effective interactions.

Dialogic teaching strategies, then, make use of the power of talk in order to stimulate and extend students' thinking, as well as to advance their learning and understanding.
